Out of curiosity, Harry begins studying magic. The black magic reveals the hidden secret that his parents' death was no accident; instead, they were murdered by the evil-minded Lord Voldemort. Voldemort, the murderer aimed at killing the infant Harry. But his murderous attack got back to himself. His magical power was badly crippled.

Among the books in the Harry Potter Series, the first four books set the stage for the climatic event, which is to begin in Book IV. Voldemort regains a corporeal body and returns to power. He has never grasped the reality that all these beings and matters have power beyond his own and even beyond the reach of any magic. Voldemort's essence lies in seven Horcruxes. Till the Horcruxes exist, none could put an end to him. Harry, Ron and Hermione venture destroy the six Horcruxes. Later they realize the seventh Horcruxes exists in Harry himself. The 'Killing Curse' sent by Voldemort failed while facing Harry. The Curse blasted a piece of the tainted essence of Voldemort. It got bonded to Harry. So it is evident that when Harry lives, there is no death for Voldemort. Harry bears the evil, which is not his own. Harry resolves meet sacrificial death in order to save others from the evil force. Harry is sure that he does seek the help of others nor someone else involve in the fight with the evil. He decided it has got to be him alone.

Severus Snape is another character through whom the motif of sacrificial love is applied in *Harry Potter Series*. There is a sub-plt in the Series, centred on the sacrificial love of sacrificial love. Snape is the often-irritable Potions teacher at Hogwarts. There is a secret hidden in his past history. Snape was once an admirer of Lily, Harry's mother. He did not want her to be married to a man, who, according to him was reckless and mature. Of course, Lily was not aware of his love to her. They describe themselves as "perfectly normal. Basically, Draco Malfoy believes that most pureblooded wizards are superior to the other wizards and the magical creatures. His first meeting with Harry reveals his dislime for the all other groups. He describes Hagrid, the half-giant wizard as a savage, living in a hut in the Hogwarts school campus. Malfoy criticises Hagrid as one who is a drunkard, trying to do magic, and setting fire to his own bed. He starts his enquiry on Harry's parents. He is curious to know the practices of the old wizarding families by knowing about Harry's parents. Harry's journey involves confronting prejudice and learning to accept himself and others, including those with different backgrounds or abilities.

Friendship and lovalty

Harry Potter Series is a wonderful delienation of friendship woven through the life of the characters. The bond of friendship is the central theme, with the trio of Harry, Ron, and Hermione consistently demonstrating unwavering loyalty and support for each other in the face of adversity.
